Bouldnor Forest Ponds Water Blitz and Identifying Pillwort

Flagship Ponds are the very best of Britain's Priority Ponds: sites of national importance because of the threatened species or communities they support. The Flagship Ponds project aims to help local people and land managers protect the very special species present on these sites.

Bouldnor Forest has historical records for the Priority Species Pillwort. This plant is declining rapidly in the UK and is now restricted to just a handful of scattered locations. The Flagship Project plans to recover the Pillwort population at Bouldnor.



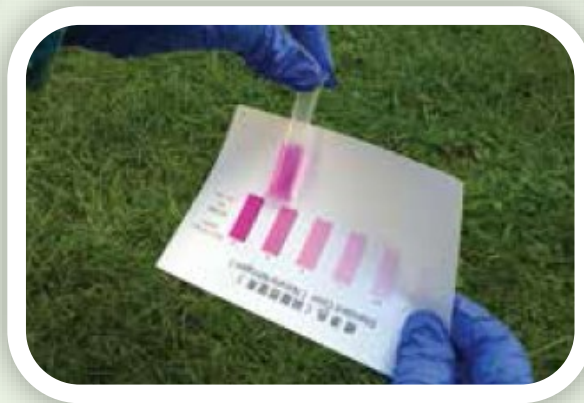
Wetland Plant ID
